

SAFER SCHOOL STREETS FOR FROME

POP UP

Frome Town Council is exploring making the streets around Oakfield, Trinity and Critchill a School Street. This means that we will be asking you to actively travel to school, walking, cycling or scooting and if you need to drive, to park and stride 5 minutes where possible. We are setting up a pop up from September and would like to hear your views and experiences as it happens.

A School Street's aim is to create safer, less congested streets around the schools. By encouraging more families to actively travel, walking and cycling to school, it will reduce air pollution and enable social distancing. School Streets gives priority to walking and cycling at all times and limits vehicle access and **so walking and cycling will feel much safer.** It will be a trial, will be reviewed frequently and will leave access for anyone who lives in these streets plus school staff, buses, disabled drivers, deliveries and other personal emergencies.

What is a School Street?



A School Street is an area that limits vehicle access and prioritises walking and cycling outside schools. **All residents** who live in the School Streets area will **still be able to access their street without restriction**, as will school staff, buses and people with disabilities. All families heading to school will for the most part be asked to either actively travel, walking, cycling, scooting or where not possible, to park and stride for 5 minutes.

How will it happen?



We aim to implement a trial in three stages:

Stage 1 Pop-up installation with traffic cones and signage in September. The School Street project will be reviewed every month and can be removed if needed. As you return to school for the new term you will be asked to actively travel to school.

Stage 2 Collect feedback from schools, local residents, wider community, and improve layout. If we get extra funding from the Department for Transport, we will replace cones with planters, install cycle parking at schools and on street if desired, pocket parks and other fun stuff.

Stage 3 Decide whether the School Street should be permanent fixture.

What will it look like?




Stage 1: basic signage and cones

We have identified Oakfield Road, Somerset Road and the top of Nunney Road as a potential School Street because it links 5 schools with over 1500 pupils - Oakfield Academy, Trinity and Critchill School, with the Avanti Academy and Bright Stars nearby, to Victoria Park and runs along the NCN24 cycle route.
