Flu Vaccinations Update



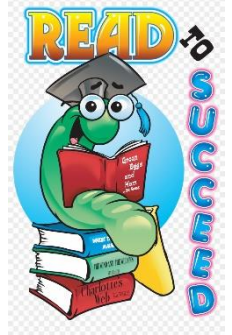
