If any parents have uniform that is too small that they are willing to donate, we would be very grateful to have it please for





Read to Succeed

We love handing out lots of reading certificates in Stars Assemblies as that means you and the children are doing a great job with reading at home. really helps This support the children as develop they their reading skills, not just

those early skills of recognising words but also their comprehension, fluency and expression - especially if adults also read to the children as well as listening to the children read. We do lots of reading in school, but it is well known that children make even better progress when our work in school is supported by lots of reading at home so we really do appreciate all the help we can get with teaching the children this vital skill.

Children who have read 5 times a week since we returned to school in September (not including the holidays) will have reached 80 reads by now. Those children who have read 7 days a week in term time will have reached 112 reads, and those children who have read 7 days a week in the holidays as well will have read 133 times so far this term. So lots of children will already be well on the way to their 200 reads and becoming a Golden Reader, which is brilliant. There is still plenty of time for those children who might not have made such a great start to catch up!

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Dropping off and Collecting

Thank you for following our new guidelines for dropping off and collecting your children. We are pleased not to be using the car park as a pedestrian access any longer. In order to ensure the changes work as well as they can, please can we ask all parents to remember the following:

- The double gates on the main playground are opened at 3pm to enable Sunshine and Rainbow parents to collect their children. They are not the way for other parents to enter the site to collect the children.
- In the afternoon, the gate at the top of the main playground is the entrance for all parents of children in Jasmine, Poppy, Oak, Maple, Holly and Bramble classes and the double gates are the exit. The top gate is opened just before 3:10pm.
- In the morning, the gate at the top of the main playground is the entrance for all parents and children from Sunshine, Rainbow, Poppy, Jasmine, Oak, Maple, Holly and Bramble classes, and the double gates are the exit.
- Please can parents of children in Pine and Gorse come onto the small playground to collect their children in the afternoon.

As with anything, we will continue to monitor the situation and adapt it again if needed.
