Attendance

We are in the process of updating our Attendance Policy and will be sharing the updated version with parents soon. Please be aware that the Department for Education has increased the focus on attendance and has raised the expectation



for school attendance from 96% to 98%.

Good school attendance really supports children in making the most progress they can with their learning and also supports the development of firm friendships and good social skills. Please work with us to ensure your child's attendance is as good as it can possibly be - an attendance rate of 98% means a child has 4 days or less absence across the school year. We know that children are unwell from time to time, and that there are times when they are so poorly that they really need to stay at home. But, if they are just a little bit under the weather, for instance they have a runny nose, a tummy ache, a mild cough or a headache, they are usually absolutely fine to be in school. We will always ring parents if we see that their child is not managing when they are unwell and we are also happy to give children medicine, such as Calpol, if you bring that to the school office. It was lovely to present the first reading certificates of the year today. We ask that listen to parents their children read on a daily basis and record this in the reading record. We count a read a

present the children with day and certificates for every 25 reads so those children who are reading daily should be reaching 25 reads now. Please support your child with their reading as daily reading at home makes such a difference to the progress the children make. For our youngest children, we count stories you read to them while they are not yet ready to read to you because we also value this as a crucial part of learning to read so do please make a note of the stories you share with your child. When a child reaches 200 reads during the school year, we present them with a badge and at the end of the year we have a special celebration of their achievement.

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Co-Opted Governor Vacancies



Our governing body is made up of volunteers who are parent governors, foundation governors, staff governors and coopted (sometimes referred to as community) governors. We currently have two vacancies for co-opted governors, who may be a parent at school, or from the wider community. It is a brilliant opportunity to play an important part in school life and an opportunity to develop new skills. Governors are responsible for deciding the framework for the development of the school and monitoring whether it is achieving its aims and objectives. We also assist with the appointment of staff, make decisions on the upkeep of the buildings and grounds, set the budget for the school and monitor how the money is spent.

With a key part of the board's role focusing on the setting and monitoring of the budget we would ideally be interested in anyone who has a background in finance/accounting in addition to having; (1) Enthusiasm for the school and for children's education; (2) The time for meetings, visits and training (the Governing Board meets 10 times a year on Tuesdays at 4.30); (3) The ability to see the wider issues i.e. the interests of all the pupils in the school.

As a Governor, you would have access to training to help build on existing skills or to develop new ones to help you in your role.

Art pop is influenced by pop art's integration of high and low culture, and which emphasises the manipulation of signs, style, and gesture over personal expression.

Art pop artists may be inspired by postmodern approaches or art theories as well as other forms of art, such as fashion, fine art, cinema, and avant-garde literature. They may deviate from traditional pop audiences and <u>rock music</u> conventions, instead exploring ideas such as pop's status as commercial art, notions of artifice and the self, and questions of historical authenticity.
