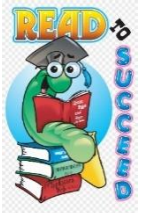
Road Safety Talk

The Good Shepherd

Once upon a time, there was a shepherd. A shepherd who had a hundred sheep. He knew each of them by sight. The white ones and the black ones. The spotted ones and the striped ones. The thin ones and the fat ones. The sleek ones and the woolly ones. And every night, after he had called them from the fields and gathered them in their pen, he would count them. One, two, three. Four, five, six. Seven, eight, nine. And all the way to a hundred. One night, he found himself a sheep short.
