HEADS UPDATE from Amanda Seager

This is the last update of this academic year, and what a year it has been! There is always so much packed into a school year that it is no wonder the children (and staff!) are feeling weary as we approach the summer break.

In some ways it feels like no time at all since we waved the Year 4 children off on their residential and welcomed our new reception children into Sunshine and Rainbow at the beginning of last September. In week two of the year we experienced an extremely successful Ofsted inspection, which validated the excellent standards of education and care across the school. We have continued to build upon this, ensuring that our standards remain high at all times. Alongside our high expectations, we are fully committed to ensuring that life at Trinity is fun, and that the children all have plenty of opportunities to try a wide variety of different things. We want to make sure that every child has the chance to shine, whether that is in the classroom, on the sports field, on the stage or on the playground.

These staff are very deserving of their summer break, and I am sure you will join me in wishing them the rest and relaxation they need over the next few weeks.


Timetable change for September

Thank you to the parents who have spoken to us with concerns regarding the slight change to our school day from September. We

absolutely recognise that reducing the amount of time the gate is open in the morning presents a challenge. The change in times represents a change to the working hours of staff and although five minutes may seem insignificant, we are not being given increased funding to meet the requirement to provide a longer school day, and as I am sure you are aware, school budgets are already very stretched. However, we are keen to do what we can to reduce the challenge of shorter window in the morning.

To that end, in September, we will trial a one-way system for access to school. This means everyone will enter the premises using the double gates to the main playground when they open at 8.40am. For parents coming onto site with their children, we ask that you walk around the building and exit our site through the gate by the school office. Mrs Seager will close the double gates at 8:45am and make her way to the other gate, which will remain open until at least 8:50am, enabling parents to have time to pass on important messages to school staff when needed.

We will monitor the situation and adapt it as we feel necessary, and where and when it is possible.

Lunches from September

The new menus will go live on Monday 29th July. Lunches will still be ordered through ParentPay with a new deadline of midnight Thursday of the week prior to taking them. You can order as far in advance as is available on the system. If the deadline is missed, a packed lunch from home will have to be provided as to reduce waste no spare meals will be available.

All children in reception, years 1 and 2 will still receive a Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM). If your child is moving up to year 3, meals will now have to be paid for in advance. The cost of a KS2 meal is £2.80 per day.

If your year 4 child is going to Hooke Court from the 4^{th} - 6^{th} September please do not order a meal during that time.

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Reading Awards

From September we will be introducing a new system to recognise the reading the children do at



home. The aim will be to become a Rainbow Reader during the five years each child is at Trinity. Every time they have completed 100 reads at home, they will be awarded a badge in line with the colours of the rainbow - red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. There will still be certificates at intervals between the badges, and a golden reader award after the rainbow is completed. We hope our new system will enable all children to have something to keep working towards year on year, and something which all children can achieve during their time here. As you know, reading at home and at school are equally important for developing early reading skills and a love of books and we look forward to enjoying your continued support with our new system.

Class Names from September

The other classes will remain as they are. This will give us Sunshine and Rainbow for our Reception classes and then all other classes will be named after trees, in line with our school logo.

Celebrating Birthdays

We love to celebrate the children's birthdays with them in school, but from September we will no longer be able to share sweets or cake with the



class at the end of the day. Instead, we invite the children to come into school on their birthday in mufti (with their birthday badge if they have one and wish to wear it) as a treat. If a child's birthday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, during a school holiday, or on a whole school mufti day, they can wear their own choice of clothes on either the school day before or the next school day after. Bookings for Term 1 (2024-2025 Sept-Oct) are open to all for new bookings


Please make all bookings and amendments through your ParentPay account by clicking on your child's name and selecting the Clubs menu.
