HEADS UPDATE

There have been two themes that have been covered across the school this week – Online Safety Day and Children's Mental Health Week. Both of these are really important for us to cover with the children, and in many ways it is a shame (although perhaps not a coincidence) that they both happen in the same week each year.

The focus for the Online Safety Day was on fake news. Each class has completed tasks related to this that are appropriate for the age of the children and the children in Willow class shared some of their class learning with the rest of key stage 2 in our assembly this morning. In addition, Mr Davies and I led assemblies earlier in the week in which we encouraged the children to consider the difference between a fact and an opinion, and how we can identify them both in the information we come across. I always feel that this kind of thing is a fine line for us as we do not want the children to lose their innocence and their trust that what they hear and read is true, but equally we have a responsibility to do our bit to prepare the children for life in the modern world.

For Children's Mental Health Week we have been focusing on belonging. We know that children (and adults) who have a strong sense of belonging (to a family, a school, a community or group) tend to enjoy much better mental health than those who don't as when they feel they belong, the children feel valued, cared for and comfortable to be themselves. We used our time this week to explore with the children the places and people they feel they belong to. The children have created beautiful, personal maps that show the places, groups and activities where they feel they belong and we will be using lots of these to create a display in the hall to celebrate their wonderful ideas.
