HEADS UPDATE

'Encourage one another and build each other up.' This is our school vision, which I have revisited with the children in my assemblies this week. As a church school, we are expected to have a theologically rooted Christian vision for our school and ours comes from one of Paul's letters to the people of Thessaloniki, in Greece. When we decided upon our vision, we were very keen to have something that not only reflected our aspirations for our children and linked with our values, but which also reflected our whole school community. At the time of Paul's letter, Thessaloniki was a city made up of many different people and Paul had brought lots of them together, regardless of their cultures or beliefs, and created a harmonious church community. He then moved on to repeat the process elsewhere, but after he left he became aware that the community was breaking apart into different groups. This prompted him to write a letter in which he urged the people to put aside their differences and to work together.

Whilst there are lots of ways in which our community is not and never has been like the fractured one that prompted Paul's letter, his words and the sentiment behind them do really resonate with us. We are a Church of England school, but we welcome everyone to our school regardless of their faith. We actively seek to celebrate differences and want our school to be somewhere where everyone feels they belong and that they are valued for the important role they play in creating our community. The values that we instil in the children are designed to support them to become people who look after each other, people who genuinely care about others, who celebrate their successes and are at their side when they need help and support, no matter who they are, where they come from, what they believe or what their starting point in life was.

World Book Day

Thursday 5th March

We have several things planned to celebrate World Book Day next week. Each class will visit Hunting Raven one day next week to exchange their token for one of the special World Book Day books. This is always a lovely trip and we are very grateful to Tina and her team for enabling us to take everyone to the shop during the week. Your child's class teachers will let you know which day they are going.

On Thursday, March 5th (World Book Day) we are inviting all the children to bring in their favourite book from home. This could be a picture book, a novel, a book of poems or rhymes, a non-fiction book, a graphic novel, a comic anything that your child enjoys reading or having read to them. During the day the children will have the chance to share their book with other children in the class so that we can spread enthusiasm for reading throughout the day and hopefully inspire the children to read something they haven't tried before.

Alongside this, the children will be creating a picture inspired by their favourite book. This will happen in school and the pictures will be entered into a competition being organised by the FOTFS committee. There will be a prize for the winning picture in each year group.

Throughout the week, we are having a whole school focus on poetry and the children will be exploring different forms of poetry and creating their own poems. Each class will be inviting parents in so that the children can share their poems the week after next. Again, class teachers will share the times and days with you.

Finally, on Thursday, we will be welcoming two visitors from the Bath Rugby Foundation who will share their favourite stories with the children in Year 2 and Year 4.
