## HEADS UPDATE

We started this week with a visit from Archdeacon Anne from the diocese, who was keen to find out more about how churches and schools work together to support the children and the wider school community. Archdeacon Anne was taken on a guided tour of the school by two of our Year 4 pupils, Albie and Alfred, who did a brilliant job. Archdeacon Anne was really impressed with the ethos of the school and the warm welcome she received. Rev'd Ian from Holy Trinity church accompanied Archdeacon Anne and described the atmosphere at our school as being really peaceful in terms of behaviour, but with a positive buzz in the way the children engage with and approach their learning. That feels like both an apt description and a great balance.

Our Year 2 children have been especially busy this week, with Share my Work sessions for both classes, a golf festival at Oakfield and a trip to Yeovil to see an orchestra performance. While very varied experiences, the children have been brilliant at all of them. It was lovely to see children being celebrated in our Stars assembly this morning for their wonderful sporting behaviour at the golf, and for their excellent listening and attention at the orchestra performance.

Thank you for all your support raising sponsorship money for the Great Athletes event. Together you have raised a fantastic amount of money, which will be used to buy new sports and active play equipment for the children. The children are being invited to share their ideas and requests via the school councillors, who will put together a wish list with Mr Reid at their next meeting. I am really looking forward to seeing what the children would like! We feel very fortunate to be in a position to be able to buy things that will significantly enhance the children's sporting and playtime experiences.

Please note that payment for the Summer Term (Term 5 and Term 6) is now available through Arbor. We have corrected the system and apologise for any confusion regarding the schedule; there will be a total of 9 sessions, with the first session officially beginning on 30th April. However, as the Year 2 pupils were on a school trip that day, they did not attend the session on 30th April.

Consequently, we have reduced the cost of the termly swimming option to £64.35 to cover 9 sessions. While we are unable to amend the specific dates shown on Arbor for those who have already signed up, please be assured there is no swimming on the 30th. If you have already paid the full price for 10 sessions and would like a refund for that missed date, please email the school office.
