HEADS UPDATE

It has been a very exciting start to this final half term of the year. Hazel and Willow classes started the week with workshops linked to their history learning on Ancient Egypt. They did some archaeology, they made some bread dough (I hope the baking went well and it tasted great!), they painted scarab beetles and they had great fun dressing up. On Tuesday, the children in Chestnut and Beech classes had a close encounter with a number of reptiles and insects when Tropical Discoveries came to visit them. There were lots of children who were very proud to have held a tarantula – and rightly so in my opinion! This was part of their geography learning on Australia. Yesterday afternoon we welcomed author Lucy Rowland, who came to talk to the children in Years 1 and 2 about her latest book, 'Magpie and the Sparkling Words'. The children had a wonderful afternoon hearing Lucy share her story, and then taking part in a mass draw-a-long to create a front cover for the book. The visit was organised for us by Hunting Raven and we are really grateful for the opportunity to meet Lucy.

Over the last few years we have made a conscious decision to bring more visitors into Trinity and to engage in as many local events as possible as this is a much more cost-effective way of continuing to give the children enriching experiences than taking them out of school on multiple trips. The cost of coach travel for a school trip is high, and we know that paying for multiple school trips can place a burden on family finances so we do keep these to a minimum. We are also really fortunate to have financial support from FOTFS with school trips, which helps to reduce the cost. When we ask for contributions towards the cost of a trip, there is always the option to 'pay it forward' by paying more than the contribution requested for any families that are able to do so, and who would like to cover the cost of a trip for a family unable to pay. On the subject of Frome events, over the next few weeks the children will all be making a mask in school that they will bring home in time to take part in the Frome Wildlife Parade on Sunday 12th July at the end of the Frome Festival. Before the half term break, we welcomed Kate and Caroline from We Are Nature, who talked to the children about the mask making and the parade and inspired them with lots of pictures and film of a whole variety of creatures they could choose as the basis for their mask.

September 2026

Please note that payment for the Summer Term (Term 5 and Term 6) is now available through Arbor. However, as the Year 2 pupils were on a school trip that day, they did not attend the session on 30th April.

Consequently, we have reduced the cost of the termly swimming option to £64.35 to cover 9 sessions.
