HEADS UPDATE

from Amanda Seager

Well, this has been an interesting week! Thank you for your patience and understanding with our closure. I know for some of you it might have brought back awful memories of those long weeks of home schooling during Covid – thankfully this was a much shorter break to our normal routine. Whatever the weather conditions, it is never an easy decision to close the school and we know that what will be right for one family will not work so well for another, depending on individual circumstances. Happily we were still able to welcome Selina Gunn from the library service, who talked to the children this morning about the summer reading challenge – you will find more information about this further on in the newsletter.

My main focus for this week has been reading through the end of year reports for each child and putting my comments on them. Although it takes quite a while to read nearly 300 reports, I love reading them, and I hope you will enjoy reading your child's report as well. I am often reminded of something special a child has achieved during the year, and the children's own reflections on their year are often a joy to read too.

This morning we took delivery of a wonderful Marshall speaker that has been very kindly donated by one of our parents, Kevin Penney. The speaker will be really useful at a number of different school events – our plays and concerts, Trinity's Got Talent for example, as well as for FOTFS events like the Summer Fair tomorrow. We are very grateful!

You may recall a couple of weeks ago I mentioned the phonics screening check and the multiplication tables check. We have now had official confirmation of our results and I am delighted to say that our Year 1 children achieved a pass rate of 95% in the phonics check, and our average score in the Year 4 tables check was 23 out of 25. Both results are testament to the hard work put in by everyone involved – pupils, teachers and parents. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Trinity Nursery Opening

September 2026

We are thrilled to be able to start offering nursery provision at Trinity from September 2026!

The refurbishment of our nursery building is now officially underway, and the work is progressing wonderfully. It is so exciting to see the space start to transform, and we are very much looking forward to welcoming our first children in September.

We already have lots of children signed up to start with us in September, January, and April of the next academic year! However, we still have spaces available. If you or someone you know is interested in a place, please get in touch—we would love to welcome you to the Trinity family.

Trinity Nursery will operate in term time only, with opening hours that are in line with our extended school provision – from 8am until 5:30pm Monday to Thursday and from 8am to 4pm on Fridays.

Summer Reading Challenge 2026

Read to the Beat

We were delighted to welcome Selina from the Library Outreach team today, who spoke to the children about how they can take part in this year's Summer Reading Challenge

Sign Up is completely free at your local library starting **Saturday, 4th July**

Children are encouraged to borrow and read **six library books** over the summer holidays. This can include stories, fact books, poetry, graphic novels, or even eBooks and audiobooks.

As they smash their reading goals, children collect special stickers and character cards (illustrated by award-winning artist Harry Woodgate).

Completing the challenge earns them a certificate and a medal!

The Mini Challenge (For Pre-Schoolers)

A special **Mini Challenge** is available for toddlers and pre-schoolers (ages 0–3).

Parents and carers can log the picture books they share together.

Little ones collect their own special stickers and a gold reward sticker upon completion.

Please note that payment for the Summer Term (Term 5 and Term 6) is now available through Arbor. We have corrected the system and apologise for any confusion regarding the schedule; there will be a total of 9 sessions, with the first session officially beginning on 30th April. However, as the Year 2 pupils were on a school trip that day, they did not attend the session on 30th April.

Consequently, we have reduced the cost of the termly swimming option to £64.35 to cover 9 sessions. While we are unable to amend the specific dates shown on Arbor for those who have already signed up, please be assured there is no swimming on the 30th. If you have already paid the full price for 10 sessions and would like a refund for that missed date, please email the school office.
