HEADS UPDATE

There really is only one thing I can write about this week and that is the wonderful Trinity's Got Talent!

I am sure many of you have already seen the photos and videos on Class Dojo, that give a little flavour of the event, but oh what a joyous morning we had! We started with Sunshine and Rainbow classes each singing a song they had learned – complete with musical instruments and actions. Miss Armiger has been teaching the children their songs and they absolutely did her proud. We then had three piano recitals from children in Oak class, followed by a ukulele group from Maple class. From Beech class we had two children reciting poems – one of which had been written by the child herself. Next we had a group performance of Twinkle Twinkle from some of the Chestnut class girls, followed by a cornet solo that involved some audience participation too. The Hazel class representatives were two solo performances, one a song and the other on the electric guitar. Willow class gave us an amazing duet, followed by a group performance of Hot Cross Buns. From Pine class we had a piano solo, and then another solo performance that involved both singing and playing the guitar. Our final acts from Sycamore class were another piano solo and then the first performance of CLEW, a four-piece rock band. Once the children's performances were complete, Mr Reid led several members of the staff team in performing for the children, which needless to say the children all loved!

It was amazing to see the variety of talent within our school and also to see the bravery and resilience of the children who stood on the stage in front of the whole school and performed. The children in the audience were also brilliant, they clapped and cheered every act, even though I am sure some of them would have been disappointed not to have been chosen to perform their acts today. There was definitely a lot of excited chatter about what they might prepare for next year when I visited the classes this afternoon, so I am sure this will become an annual tradition and we will see many more amazing acts next July.

Great British Summer Savings

Message from Dept for Education

Rising prices can make life's little treats harder to afford, especially during the school holidays when costs build up for families. This Government is determined to help, and that is why last month the Chancellor announced the Great British Summer Savings scheme.

From 25 June to 1 September 2026, the Government is temporarily cutting VAT from 20% to 5% on children's meals in restaurants, children and family tickets to cinemas, theatres, concerts and exhibitions, and admission to a wide range of attractions. Combined with free bus travel during August for children aged 5 to 15 in England, families and young people will be able to enjoy experiences that make summer special, including visits to the kinds of cultural and educational attractions that enrich children's lives outside the classroom.

Please note that payment for the Summer Term (Term 5 and Term 6) is now available through Arbor. We have corrected the system and apologise for any confusion regarding the schedule; there will be a total of 9 sessions, with the first session officially beginning on 30th April. However, as the Year 2 pupils were on a school trip that day, they did not attend the session on 30th April.

Consequently, we have reduced the cost of the termly swimming option to £64.35 to cover 9 sessions. While we are unable to amend the specific dates shown on Arbor for those who have already signed up, please be assured there is no swimming on the 30th. If you have already paid the full price for 10 sessions and would like a refund for that missed date, please email the school office.

Additionally, if you are a Trust Fund pupil, you may use your funds to pay for these lessons; simply email the office so we can check your balance and arrange this for you. Thank you.

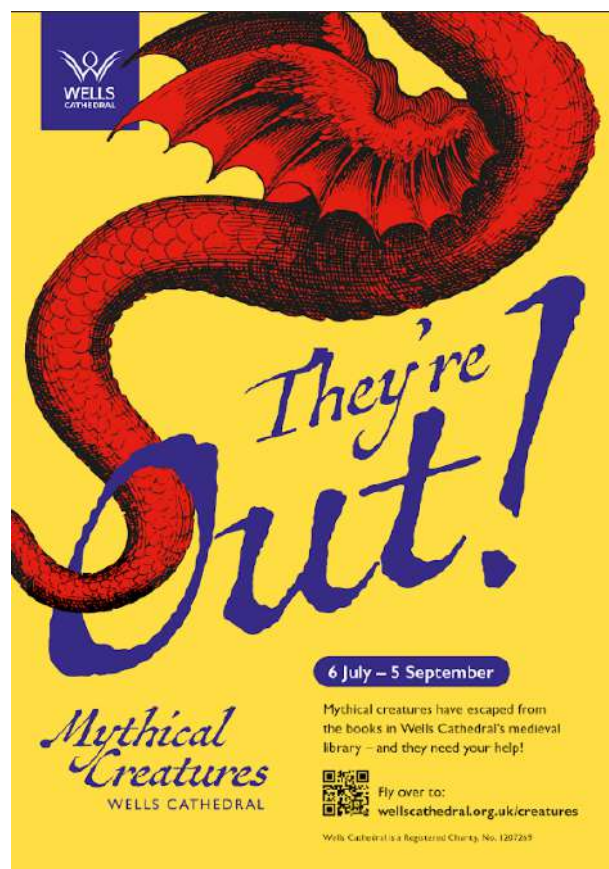
Wildlife Parade - Sunday 12 July Updated hot weather plan
